The connector end is polished and tested to ensure low insertion loss and high return loss, while the bare fiber end is designed to be spliced to a main fiber optic cable in the field. This design allows pigtails to transmit light efficiently from the main fiber to equipment, patch panels, or optical distribution frames.

How Pigtails Transmit Light

Fiber optic pigtails transmit light in the same way as standard fiber optic cables. Single-mode pigtails (OS1/OS2) carry a single light signal over long distances, suitable for telecom networks and FTTH applications. Multimode pigtails (OM1-OM5) carry multiple light modes, reflecting within the fiber core, and are used for shorter distances such as data centers and LANs. The light travels through the fiber core with minimal loss when the pigtail is properly spliced and connected.
