

How long should the fiber optic splice sheath be



Article Overview

The typical fiber optic splice sheath should be removed or exposed to a length of approximately 2 meters (6 feet) to allow proper splicing and slack management.

Recommended Sheath Length

For most fiber optic installations, the outer cable sheath should be removed about 2 meters (6 feet) from the cable end. This length provides sufficient fiber to perform splicing, manage slack, and store fibers neatly in splice trays without stressing the fibers. The exact length may vary depending on the type of splice closure, cable construction, and local company practices, but 2 meters is generally sufficient for standard indoor and outdoor closures.
