Standard Core Counts

Outdoor fiber optic cables are designed to accommodate both current connectivity and future growth. Common core counts include:

- Low-count cables: 2, 4, 6, or 12 cores, often used for small distribution runs or point-to-point connections .
- Medium-count cables: 24, 48, or 72 cores, suitable for enterprise backbones, campus networks, or main distribution links .
- High-density cables: 144, 288, 432, or even 864 cores, typically used for metropolitan, carrier, or long-haul backbone networks .

Factors Influencing Core Selection

- Network devices and endpoints: Each device generally requires two cores—one for sending and one for receiving data. For example, connecting 10 devices would require at least 20 cores .
- Redundancy and future-proofing: Extra cores are often included to allow for network expansion, testing, or backup in case of fiber damage. A typical design may include 10-20% spare cores .
- Single-mode vs multimode: Outdoor cables are usually single-mode for long-dista...
