Primary distribution boxes feature multiple terminals connected to main busbars, serving as the central hub for distributing power to secondary and tertiary circuits while ensuring safety and reliability.

Overview of Primary Distribution Box Terminals

The primary distribution box is the main distribution point in a building or construction site, typically receiving power from the low-voltage side of a transformer (0.4 kV) and distributing it to secondary distribution boxes or directly to large equipment. The terminals in a primary distribution box are the connection points where incoming and outgoing cables are secured, usually via copper busbars for optimal electrical contact. These terminals are designed to handle high current loads and provide a reliable interface for multiple outgoing circuits.

Components and Terminal Functions

- **Main Busbars:** Solid copper or aluminum strips that connect all terminals and distribute power evenly across outgoing circuits. Terminals are attached to these busbars to allow secure connections for feeders.
- **Incoming Terminals:** Connect the primary power source (from the transformer or substation) to the main busbars. These terminals are often equipped with isolation switches to safely disconnect the box for maintenance.
- **Outgoing Terminals:** Connect to secondary distribution boxes, large equipment, or construction site loads. Each outgoing terminal may be protected by a circuit break...
