

What is relay protection logic



Article Overview

Relay protection logic is the decision-making framework within a protective relay that determines when to trip a circuit breaker to isolate faulty or abnormal electrical conditions.

Overview

Relay protection logic refers to the internal rules and conditions programmed or designed into a protective relay that allow it to detect faults or abnormal operating conditions in a power system and initiate corrective actions, typically by tripping a circuit breaker . It ensures that only the affected portion of the system is isolated, minimizing damage and maintaining system stability.

How It Works

- Sensing: Protective relays continuously monitor electrical quantities such as current, voltage, frequency, and impedance through inputs from current transformers (CTs) and voltage transformers (PTs) .
- Decision Logic: The relay compares measured values against preset thresholds or logic conditions. For example:
 - Overcurrent logic trips when current exceeds a set limit for a specified time.
 - Differential logic trips when the current entering a zone does not match the current leaving it.
 - Distance or impedance logic operates based on calculated line impedance .
- Trip Output: If the logic conditions indicate a fault, the relay sends a trip signal to the circuit breaker or other interrupting device
